From Your Chairman

Northeast has finished the 2016 road paving projects. The Town was able to pave more miles than originally planned due to lower asphalt cost. If the Town can keep to the planned number of miles to be addressed according to the five year rolling plan, we should be able to close the gap on needed road maintenance. Administrator Kalms presented the Public Works Committee and Town Board with a projection of the results of the continued effort to catch up with maintenance. It is available at the Town Office.

Scott Construction will begin chip sealing after the Fourth of July. Residents of those roads will be contacted by mail. Chip Sealing extends the life of a road by five to seven years.

A focus group is considering possible options for the Community Center building in Ellison Bay. Major maintenance is needed and group is discussing various alternatives.

The town Board passed a resolution supporting Door County Broadband effort to secure a grant for continued construction of towers. WPS has a grant program to extend broadband service to rural areas. Economic Development and the Town Board has recognized the importance of providing adequate service to underserved areas within the Town.

Economic Development is working on putting together a group to head the possible charrette for the Town in conjunction with UW Extension. The group would address the application process. It is anticipated the group would begin in late fall, early winter.

- 1). The work is proceeding on the storm water pipe replacement on Cedar Shore road. The first sections of the old pipe that were unearthed showed holes where rust had eaten the metal away. When completed the standing water that had been an issue along the road should not be a factor, as the water will be channeled to a rain garden, filtered, then out to the bay.
- 2). Questions have been asked about the progress of improving our Town roads as a result of the levy override a couple years ago. This is reflected in the road rating exercise that is done during the fall of the odd numbered years, which is then turned over to the Wisconsin Department of Transportation. In comparing the ratings of 2009 vs. 2015, we see a significant drop in roads that are rated 2, 3, and 4 (the roads that are in the best shape are given a "10" rating). These lower rated roads formerly comprised about 21% of all Town roads. The current rating shows they now comprise about 7% of the total. The roads will be scored again in the fall of 2017. The graph depicting this information was distributed at a previous Town Board meeting, and can be viewed in the Town office.
