

From your Town Chairman

The Board has approved Resolution 7-21 supporting a Broadband Expansion Grant application for the fiscal year 2022. Tech Committee Chairman David Studebaker brought the possibility of the Town participating with Insight in the grant application. Insight is the parent company of Cellcom and has installed a fiber optic cable north through Door County to Washington Island. As part of the route passes through Liberty Grove to Northport, there is a possibility of serving approximately 100 homes in the Gills Rock/Northport area with broadband connections to the cable. The board committed its American Rescue Plan funds as our contribution to the grant application. This decision came after a lot of discussion of how this could be the pilot project for fiber optic cable expansion throughout Liberty Grove. Insight, as well as other providers, are aware of our desire to eventually have fiber optic broadband available town wide. This is a major project undertaking by the Town as broadband is considered vital to the health, safety, and welfare of our community.

Public Nuisance Ordinance 5-21 was also passed by the Board after considerable discussion and tweaking of the wording. Various State Statutes and the Village Powers Authority provides the guidance and authority of the Town to adopt such an ordinance. The Town has received inquiries/complaints of how the Town may control noise, various public nuisances, as defined by statutes, in the interest of public safety and order. The Town attorney will review the Ordinance and may suggest some additions or revisions which would be added. The Ordinance becomes active after posting. A copy will be available at the Town Office and on the website.

A single bid was received for the former Betty Weborg home on the Mariner Park property. The Board accepted the bid, and the structure will need to be removed by December 31st of this year. Two additional structures will be removed by the Town as part of the plan for the Mariner Park plan. The completion of the park is estimated to take 3-5 years.

Lake Michigan Water Levels

All lakes are 6 to 19 inches below levels from this time last year in 2020. Forecasted July 2nd levels remain above their long-term monthly averages for July except for Lake Ontario, which is 11 inches below its longterm average. Lake Superior surpasses its long-term average for July by only 2 inches. By August 2nd Lakes St. Clair and Erie are forecast to fall 4 and 2 inches, respectively, while Lakes Superior and Ontario will rise 1 inch each. The forecast for Michigan-Huron predicts the lake will remain near its current level by August 2nd. See our <u>Daily Levels</u> web page for more water level information.

Severe Weather/Loss of Power

In the instance of a power outage, the Town Hall has a generator. If you need to use a PC, or to fill water bottles, use of a restroom, the facilities are available to you during the day. In the case of an extended power outage arrangements will be made with Emergency Services and the office.

Replacement address signs from the County

The County Board has changed the fees for address (fire number) signs. The initial sign, post, and installation is now \$75 and a replacement sign is now \$25. It is NOT allowable to paint faded fire number signs as this is a violation of the County Ordinance. The painting of signs will incur the replacement fee and may also include a citation/forfeiture. The paint required for the fire signs needs to be a certain grade of paint for visibility in daylight/darkness. It is necessary for owners to pay the replacement fee as the Sheriff's Department and Emergency Services use these signs to locate driveways and residences.
