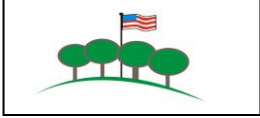

FROM YOUR TOWN CHAIRMAN

The Board has passed Resolution #12-21 Recognizing the Liberty Grove Historical Society. A copy may be found on the Town web site. On Sunday August 30th the Society sponsored a dedication event to open the "Fire and First Responders Memorial". Lee Telfer gave a presentation of the history of the Fire Department and Northern Door First Responders which was very interesting. The Sister Bay Liberty Grove Fire Department dates back to June of 1930 and the First Responders back to August of 1990. The Post Office building in Ellison Bay was the fire station at one point in time.

The Historical Society has done a wonderful job of recording the history of our community with many artifacts, buildings, and events. Well worth the time to visit and revisit as they continue to install exhibits and update the site.

The Finance Committee is continuing to develop the 2022 Budget. All committee and Board meetings are now being held via Zoom in response to the surge of COVID cases in the county. Meetings and agendas are posted on the Town website. Economic Development and Technology committees will hold a first ever joint meeting on September 28th. Both groups are addressing similar issues but from different perspectives and it was felt a sharing of information and ideas would be beneficial.

Lake Michigan Water Levels

All the Great Lakes are below their levels of a month ago. Lakes Superior and St. Clair are 2 inches lower, Erie is 3 inches lower, and Michigan-Huron and Ontario are 1 inch lower. While Michigan-Huron, Erie, and St. Clair are well above their long-term August monthly average water levels, Superior and Ontario are within a couple inches of their averages. However, all the lakes remain below their water levels of a year ago. Projections indicate water levels will continue to fall over the next month. August 27th estimates show Lake Superior dropping 1 inch, Michigan-Huron dropping 3 inches, St. Clair and Ontario dropping 4 inches, and Erie dropping 5 inches. Severe Weather/Loss of Power

In the instance of a power outage, the Town Hall has a generator. If you need to use a PC, or to fill water bottles, use of a restroom, the facilities are available to you during the day. In the case of an extended power outage, arrangements will be made with Emergency Services and the office.

Replacement fire signs from the County

The County Board has changed the fees for fire signs. The initial sign, post, and installation is now \$75 and a replacement sign charge was added and is now \$25. It is NOT allowable to paint faded fire signs as this is a violation of the Ordinance. The painting of signs will incur the replacement fee and may also include a citation/forfeiture. The paint required for the fire signs needs to be a certain grade of paint for visibility in daylight/darkness. It is necessary for owners to pay the \$25 replacement fee as the Sheriff's Department and Emergency Services use these signs to locate the driveways/residences. A reminder to all new residents of Liberty Grove

Currently the town does not provide garbage pickup at your residence. That must be arranged through private garbage hauling companies that might service your road. The town does provide a recycling drop off site at Going Garbage on Old Stage Rd. There you can bring in your Liberty Grove recycling divided into two separations. One is flattened cardboard, newspapers, magazines, and junk mail. Cardboard items should not be wet and free of food or bathroom debris. The other is aluminum cans, tin cans, plastics numbered 1-7 and unbroken glass bottles and jars. All lids from bottles and jars should be removed and thrown in regular trash. All food containers should be rinsed out well. Items not allowed are Styrofoam and plastic bags. Foil trays can be recycled if they have been completely cleaned out.
