

**FROM YOUR TOWN CHAIRMAN**

The Budget Hearing on the proposed 2021 total Town tax levy to be collected in 2022 was held on Tuesday November 9 at the Town Hall. In addition to the Board, Administrator, and Clerk/Treasurer 7 persons attended the meeting. No comments were made, and the hearing adjourned to the Special Town Meeting. Electors adopted the 2021 levy in the amount of \$2,594,734.00 which was within the limits allowed by statute. It is just over \$20,000.00 more than the levy adopted last year. Electors also approved the Town Board to dispose of 2,057 sq. ft. of land and accept 2,057 sq. ft. of land from a separate parcel. This was done to bring several cemetery plots into the existing cemetery in exchange for providing the landowner with an equal amount of land. Following the hearing and Special Town Meeting the Board adopted the proposed budget on a vote of 5-0. In Addition, they also adopted the 2022 Utility District Budget and the land acceptance/disposal.

For those who were unable to attend the meeting the approved budget will be posted on the Town website for your information.

While the meetings on the 9th were held in-person at the Town Hall Committee and Board meetings will continue to be held via Zoom. Zoom meetings are open to the public with instructions on joining available on the postings for the various meetings. The Town Office is open but unvaccinated persons are asked to wear masks.

The Town has been notified its application for the latest broadband grant from PSC was successful. We have also been notified by DCEDC that the consultant for the county-wide broadband project will present his findings to the Steering Committee on November 10th. One suggestion will be to hire a staff person to coordinate Broadband throughout the County to have a comprehensive, holistic approach to building a network.

## **COVID-19 Booster Information:**

For those who received Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine, are aged 18 and older, a booster dose is recommended no sooner than 2 full months after receiving the first dose.

For those who received Moderna or Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine, it is recommended that the following populations receive a booster dose of Moderna or Pfizer no sooner than 6 months after receiving their second dose of Moderna or Pfizer in order to further strengthen their immunity:

- People 65 years and older
- All residents in long-term care
- People ages 18 and older with certain [underlying medical conditions](#)
- People ages 18 and older who are at increased risk for COVID-19 exposure and transmission because of their job or institutional settings. [Occupations at increased risk for COVID-19 exposure](#)

**To further explain the 6-month timing, if you received your second dose of Pfizer or Moderna on May 14, for example, you are not eligible to receive your booster until on or after November 14.**

Additionally, eligible individuals may choose which vaccine they receive as a booster dose. Some people may have a preference for the vaccine type that they originally received, and others may prefer to get a different booster. CDC's recommendations now allow for this type of mix and match dosing for booster shots. Door County Public Health has Pfizer and J&J brands of COVID-19 vaccine.

**We do not have the Moderna vaccine; some of other COVID vaccinators in the community are able to provide Moderna. Currently, the Pfizer booster authorization only applies to people whose primary series was Pfizer vaccine. Please bring your vaccine card with you when you come to your appointment.**
