On behalf of the Town Board and administration I would like to thank Paul Schwengel for his service to our community. His input, research and comments were always well thought out and very appreciated. Paul has decided to retire from the Board and the committees he serves on. Thank you, Paul.

The Annual Town Meeting will be held on April 19th at the Town Hall starting at 7:00 PM. Committee chairs will have brief updates on their projects, a report from the Town's accounting firm and a special presentation from Bob Webb of Nsight. He is V.P. of IT Services and Innovative Technical Operations. His report will be on the partnership with Liberty Grove to provide Town-wide fiber optic broadband. He will also answer questions from those in attendance.

The Economic Development Committee will hear a presentation from Mariah Goode of the Door County Housing Partnership at their meeting on April 12th. The meeting begins at 6:00 PM in the Town Hall.

The Board has approved a reduction in the cost of signs and installation on the stairs at Porte des Morts Park.

GFL Environmental presented a cost estimate for Town-wide waste and recycling pickup. It was determined that the estimated cost exceeded what the Town had encumbered to invest in the project.

Currently all committee and Board meetings are being held in person at the Town Hall. Meetings are open to the public with agendas posted on the Town Website. The Town Office is also open to the public.

Wisconsin Help for Home Owners

The pandemic has financially impacted thousands of Wisconsin families

Wisconsin Help for Homeowners (WHH) is a new statewide program that can help with overdue bills like mortgage payments, property taxes, and utilities. The program is available to Wisconsin homeowners with overdue housing-related bills, both with and without a mortgage, who meet income and other eligibility requirements, and have experienced a qualified economic hardship since January 21, 2020.

This \$92 million federally funded program provides a maximum of \$40,000 in assistance for eligible households.

What is the purpose of Defibs4DoorCounty?

• Raise funds to increase the number of automatic external defibrillators (AEDs) in key locations

throughout the county and help save lives

• Match an anonymous \$75,000 donation to add approximately **80 new AEDs** to Door County's inventory

- Address an important **public safety need**:
- For every minute that passes without CPR and defibrillation, the chances of survival decrease 7-10%*
- Most cardiac arrests occur in public places are "shockable," making AEDs in public places vital*
- Over 2 million people visit Door County each year**
- 39% of Door County's year-round population is 60 or older***

When is the Defibs4DoorCounty Campaign?

- Fundraising now through Labor Day 2022
- Application process for AEDS is in two phases: February 1 for government agencies and April 1 for other organizations (see below)

Who Can Request An AED?

- Government agencies (police, fire, EMS and DNR, may submit applications for new AEDs starting February 1
- Schools, places of worship, theaters, and venues/businesses with large public gatherings) can apply starting April 1

How To Request An AED

- Complete an AED request application
- See guidelines required for receiving an AED
- Request AED/CPR training
- All applications will be reviewed and prioritized by the Door County Fire Chiefs Association
