FROM YOUR TOWN CHAIRMAN

The Economic Development Committee at our next meeting will focus on attainable housing with Mariah Goode from Door County Housing Partnership. Mariah is also in the planning department for the County of Door. We are looking at the five acre parcel adjacent to the south of the Town Hall and a portion of the acreage behind the Town Hall as currently the best location available. VanderLeest Soil Testing will be researching the soil conditions on those parcels to determine wastewater treatment options.

Town residents will be hearing a lot about our plans for town wide fiber optic cable as we move forward with its implementation. I have asked members of our Tech Committee to provide their backgrounds/expertise so the public will be aware of the pool of knowledge/experience being provided to the Town Board, administration, and community. The committee is instrumental in working with Nsight on the fiber optic project.

Kirk Scattergood - Recently retired and moved to Liberty Grove. After receiving an engineering degree at MIT and his medical degree at Johns Hopkins, pursued a career in Retina and Vitreous Surgery. The final 27 years of his career were in Green Bay with BayCare Clinic. During this time he headed the information systems committee and helped shepherd the development of the information system for BayCare Clinic as well as Aurora BayCare Medical Center. The main accomplishment during this time was the implementation of a comprehensive electronic medical records system.

David Studebaker - Tech Committee Chairman, has been involved with computer software design and development since the early 1960s. He has worked for large companies and small companies in addition to the startup of several businesses. He and his wife Karen owned and operated small computer systems businesses delivering hardware, software, and services, specializing in custom programming, from the early 1980s until retirement in the mid 2010s. Although the businesses were small, they serviced customers across North America and several Western European countries. In 2006 wrote a computer programming textbook focused on the products they sold. That text is going into its 7th edition

Cathy Ward - Her interest and knowledge of government began in her early teens. She earned a BA in History in 1976 from Southwest Texas State University. Awareness of concerns and issues of residents and business of Liberty Grove and Door County has been gained from living, working and raising a family in Liberty Grove since 1978. Cathy is a Town Board member, Chairs the Parks, and Properties Committee, is on the Plan Commission and represents the Town on the Tourism Council.

Dan Watts - Started a career in Electronics in High School working in a tv repair shop. Has been a Circuit Design Engineer since 1981. Worked at Bosch, Baxter Medical, Teledyne and Johnson Controls. Founded Watts Unlimited in 2004 doing technical consulting, product development and electronic product production. Products included medical devices, microwave amplifiers for satellite communications and industrial diamond manufacturing. Has published 15 articles on the use and applications of LEDs. Received Lifetime Achievement Award from Aerospace Lighting Institute for his work on aircraft lighting plus has four utility patents.

Lester H Keeper III - Received his BA in Chemistry from Lake Forest College and his MSBA in General Management from Indiana University-Northwest. Over his career he has been responsible for the development of new products, installation of production systems/facilities and production of products for several Fortune 500 companies. He established laboratory and process technology systems for advanced ceramic, electro-deposition coating, powder coating and high energy magnet industries in addition to writing quality control and MIS systems. He was the co-founder of Prism Analytic Technologies, Inc(Prism). He created new market applications for air testing and monitoring that included TDT Air Scan and Home Aircheck. In 2012 received the Entrepreneur of the Year from Central Michigan/CMU Research Center. In 2014 Prism was awarded the Michigan 50 Companies to Watch by the State of Michigan, Michigan Celebrates Small Companies. In 2017 the laboratory and field-testing services were acquired by Montrose Environmental Group which formed MAX Analytical Technologies. Lester retired following the acquisition of MAX Analytical Technologies by Thermo Fisher Scientific.

The Board has decided to retain the services of Harmari STR to monitor short term rentals in Liberty Grove. After reviewing our current vendor and Hamari it was concluded that Harari was a better fit for what we wanted to receive in return for the investment. The main focus for Liberty Grove is the waste treatment/disposal system STR's have in place so the rental WWTP does not exceed what was permitted by the county. In addition a large number of the rentals are in residential zones.



The 2022 Electronic Recycling/Shredfest is scheduled for Saturday September 17, 9-1pm at the Town of Liberty Grove. Liberty Grove and Sister Bay Residents only.

Lake Michigan Lake Levels.

Forecasted water levels for June 3rd are 1 inch above to 6 inches below water levels from a year ago on all lakes, besides Lake Ontario, which is 18 inches above last year's level. All the lakes have experienced a rise in lake level since last month, except Lake Ontario which fell an inch below its water level of a month ago; the remaining lakes are 2 to 8 inches above levels of a month ago. Forecasted levels for June 3rd on all lakes are above their long-term monthly average June levels by 4 to 12 inches. In the next month, forecasts show water levels rising 3 inches on Lake Superior, 2 inches on Lake Michigan-Huron, 1 inch on Lake St. Clair, falling 1 inch on Lake Erie, and falling 2 inches on Lake Ontario. Fireworks

When shooting fireworks over the 4th of July holiday please be aware that a permit is required through the Town office. It does require the signature of the Town Chairman and the Fire Chief.

Please plan to get your permit early, issuance of a permit the day before is not possible.

It will require proof of liability insurance. That can be faxed to our office at 920-854-7366. Permit applications are available on the Town's website. Have a safe 4th of July.

Outdoor Fires

Having an outdoor fire in the evening is always a fun family event. A portable firepit with a mesh enclosure to capture hot embers is obviously the safest to use.

If you have an open firepit please remember that your fires should be no larger than a fire that you would cook over and should never be left unattended. Grass fires can start easily and get out of hand very quickly. Have a hose or a fire extinguisher nearby for safety.

Parks

It is a great time to visit Liberty Grove's 14 Town parks. Our web site has our parks listed with a brief description of what they offer and how to get to them. Pack a picnic basket and head out while the weather is nice.

<u>Small pre-built storage buildings</u> If you are contemplating purchase of a pre-built storage building, you will need to check with the Land Use Department at the Government Center in Sturgeon Bay for a zoning permit. Once a permit is issued there, check with the Liberty Grove building inspector regarding a Town building permit. Certain requirements are in force for any structure greater than 200 square feet in floor area.

<u>Mailbox location</u> The Town Board has revised its mailbox ordinance regarding the placement of these boxes. The main thing to remember is to locate the front of the box a minimum of 36 inches from the edge of the road pavement. Contact the Town office at 920- 854-2934 with any questions or check the Town website to view the ordinance. The Town staff can help with information for the proper location.

DEFIBS4DOORCOUNTY CAMPAIGN MORE THAN HALFWAY TO GOAL, AMPS UP SUMMER FUNDRAISING AND AWARENESS EFFORTS

Public asked to donate and take an active bystander role to help save lives

Door County, WI, May 26, 2022 – The first week in June marks a noticeable uptick in people out and about in Door County. It is also <u>National CPR and AED Awareness Week</u> and a milestone for the Door County Fire Chiefs Association's <u>Defibs4DoorCounty campaign</u> as it enters the home stretch toward a fundraising goal to purchase 80 new automatic external defibrillators (AEDs) for the county.

Access to AEDs and the swift action of bystanders are especially important to lifesaving in a rural community like Door County that attracts more than 2 million visitors a year, hosts numerous large public events and where nearly 4 in 10 people who live here year-round are 60 or older.

"Immediately calling for help is critical and instinctive for many people, yet non-professionally trained individuals often are not aware they can do more than punch three numbers into a cellphone and provide the accurate location of the patient," said Chris Hecht, president of the Door County Fire Chiefs Association. "The time after 9-1-1 is called and before first responders arrive is when a bystander can help improve a cardiac arrest victim's chance of surviving by administering CPR and using an AED," he added.

More than 356,000 people experience <u>out-of-hospital cardiac arrest</u> (OHCA) in the U.S. each year. For every minute that passes without CPR and defibrillation, the <u>chances of survival decrease 7-10%</u>.

About 9 out of 10 people who suffer OHCA die. CPR, especially if performed immediately, can <u>double or triple a cardiac arrest victim's chance of survival</u>. Using an AED can help further one's chances of survival and recovery. This is where bystanders can help.

Public Can Make A Difference

"Our community is fortunate to have a remarkable group of first responders, many carrying AEDs in their vehicles," Hecht said. "We are also a community of deeply committed and compassionate friends, neighbors, and vacationers - bystanders who can make a difference."

The Defibs4DoorCounty campaign encourages people to consider how they might be an active bystander to a public safety incident such as an OHCA. Three actions to consider are:

- Registering for a local CPR and AED training class
- Noticing if/where AEDs are in the places they visit often
- Learning the signs of someone experiencing cardiac arrest

AED and CPR training is available for a nominal fee throughout the year from the <u>Sister Bay & Liberty Grove Fire</u>
<u>Department</u>.

More Than Halfway To Goal

An anonymous \$75,000 donation and matching challenge from a local donor was the catalyst for the Defibs4DoorCounty campaign that was announced in February and runs through Labor Day. At present, the campaign has raised \$42,000, putting it more than halfway to the \$75,000 match goal, according to Hecht.

Most AEDs purchased with funds raised will go to first responders, including law enforcement, fire departments, EMS and DNR agents. The first AEDs donated by the campaign were delivered in March to the Door County Sheriff's Office, Sturgeon Bay Police Department and Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources. Additional AEDs have been ordered to fulfill first responder requests throughout the county.

Defibs4DoorCounty earmarked 25% of the new AEDs for high-traffic locations were people work, play and gather in Door County. Schools, churches, museums, marinas, performing arts venues and other locations attracting large groups can request an AED through the application available on www.Defibs4DoorCounty.org. Recipients of defibrillators must commit to annual maintenance costs and other guidelines listed on the application form.

The public can help meet the <u>Defibs4DoorCounty</u> fundraising challenge by making donations at www.Defibs4DoorCounty.org, in-person at local North Shore Bank and Nicolet National Bank branches and at any Door County fire station. Checks should be made payable to Defibs4DoorCounty.

Defibs4DoorCounty has aligned with numerous partners, including Door County Medical Center, The YMCA, Door County North and the Compress & Shock Foundation, committed to raising awareness of the life-save benefit AEDs and helping drive donations to the campaign.

A concert by Tent Show Troubadours to benefit Defibs4DoorCounty is scheduled for <u>June 12 at Waterfront Park</u> in Sister Bay, and the public can look for the Defibs4DoorCounty booth at Al Johnson's Goat Parade & Goat Fest, June 11, and at other events throughout Door County this summer.
