#### FROM YOUR TOWN CHAIRMAN

The Board had a presentation by Bertram Communications regarding their proposal for Town-wide fiber optic cable access. Bertram Communications is the current owner of Door County Broadband. The Board along with Technology Chairman David Studebaker, committee member Kirk Scattergood, plus audience members had the opportunity to ask questions and get clarification on several items in the presentation. The Board and Technology committee will hold a joint meeting on Monday, September 19th beginning at 6 PM. We will review the presentation as it relates to our commitment to provide fiber optic cable access Town-wide. We are currently working with Nsight and awaiting a design study documentation that was contracted through Nsight. The meeting on the 19th is open to the public and I encourage interested residents to attend.

The Board has reaffirmed its commitment to provide up to 90% of room tax revenue to Liberty Grove non-profits based upon their requests and meeting the provisions of the commitment. The additional 10% will be set aside in a Fire Department capital fund to help offset the Town's portion of funding the Department equipment. The Finance Committee will consider requests for funds at their September 26th meeting.

The license fee for Liberty Grove STR's will be \$450.00 annually. The decision was made following a lengthy discussion on the impact STRs are having on Town infrastructure, residential zoning, budget, and monitoring compliance with our ordinance regarding licensing.

Several buildings on the Mariner Park property in Gills Rock will be advertised for removal/disposal by the end of the year. Interested parties should call the Town Office or watch for the posting of the request for proposal.

The Town's modification to Heartland-10 district zoning amendment is before the County and awaiting a decision. The proposal would allow, with restrictions (CUP), certain commercial operations in Heartland-10 areas.

The Finance Committee is continuing its preparation of the budget for next year. The meetings are open to the public and posted.

Dale Stewart, chair of the Highway Committee reported that all paving and chip sealing has been completed for 2022.

David Studebaker, chair of the Technology Committee, reported that the fiber optic project in the Northport area is continuing but due to some issues, it may not be completed in full by year-end. Residents are currently being contacted by Nsight to sign up to receive fiber optic access.

#### From the Army Corps of Engineers, Lake Levels

All of the Great Lakes are in their seasonal decline with Lake Superior and Lake Michigan-Huron forecast to be 2 and 4 inches below their respective levels a month ago. Similarly, Lake St. Clair and Erie are 2 and 3 inches below their levels a month ago while Lake Ontario is 8 inches below its level on August 9<sup>th</sup>. While the forecasted level on September 9<sup>th</sup> for Lake Superior is 4 inches higher than a year ago, the remaining Great Lakes are 6 to 9 inches below their respective levels a year ago. All of the lakes are forecast to continue their seasonal decline as the basin enters the meteorological fall season. Lake Superior is forecast to fall 2 inches by October 9<sup>th</sup>. Lakes Michigan-Huron, St. Clair, Erie, and Ontario are expected to decline 3, 6, 5, and 4 inches respectively in the same timeframe. See our Daily Levels web page for more water level information.

Door County has hired a Broadband Coordinator and established a Broadband Committee to help guide the deployment of Fiber to the Premise (FTTP) throughout Door County. In addition your local municipality has a committee that is working at a local level.
